



## Sunday 21st April

'When you pass through the waters, I will be with you, And the waves will not overcome you. Do not fear, for I have redeemed you, I have called you by name, You are Mine'.

These are words from the famous hymn 'Do not be Afraid', which is based on the words of the Prophet Isaiah in Isaiah 43: 2. These words are more apt than

ever as I reflect on the state of our world. Like many, I went to bed last Saturday with news of the stabbing in Australia and woke up to the news that Iran has sent so many bombs towards Israel. I had a terrible feeling of fear and terror. What on earth is going on? Added to these events are the situation in Gaza, Ukraine, Haiti, South Sudan, Yemen and many other places. I cannot but wonder if our world will ever have peace. Why can't we learn to love each other by emphasising our common humanness rather than our differences? In church last Sunday, our Bible reading from Saint Luke Chapter 24 reminds us of Jesus' words to his disciples, Peace be with you, he said. Later, he promised that the peace that he leaves with them is not the same as the one the world gives (John 14:27). What exactly is the peace that Jesus leaves with his disciples and, by extension, for us? The clue to this question is our understating and interpretation of peace. More often than not, we interpret peace as the absence of war or violence. The dictionary defines it as a state of tranquility, freedom from disturbance or calmness. But the peace that Jesus gives us is more than any of this. The word translated into English as peace is Shalom in Hebrew. Shalom is richer and more detailed. It is not just a form of saying hello and goodbye. It is a shorter way of saying, "ma" you be filled with a sense of complete and perfect peace. You be full of well-being" o", "ma" health, prosperity, and peace of mind and spirit be upon you." Beyond a simple wish for peace

and happiness, the word suggests fullness and perfection, overflowing inner and outer joy and peaceful serenity. This inner joy is what we need more than ever today. If, like me, you feel dismayed about the present state of our world, then may you know the Shalom of Christ, for He is in Charge! Knowing that God is in charge is an inner joy and assurance. Knowing God is with us is a

divine and blessed assurance, for Emmanuel is His name. This Sunday is Vocations (Calling), and we will meet at 8 and 10 am. At 10 am, there will be facilities for younger children, and refreshments will follow in the Church Hall. We will also meet at 4 pm for the Family Praise Service to baptise Oliver and Lily. The service will be followed by Hot tea in the Hall. We will also meet at 10.30 am on Wednesday. Please do come and join any of these services. May you and all of yours know the Shalom and goodness that comes from Christ. Amen.
