Mahatma Gandhi is often quoted as saying,
"A civilisation is measured by how it treats its
weakest members" or "The greatness of a nation can
be judged by how it treats its weakest member".
Many historians have questioned whether he said this
or not. Nonetheless, the essence and importance of
these words are undeniable. Likewise, Pearl Buck's
(1892-1973), words "Our society must make it right
and possible for old people not to fear the young or
be deserted by them, for the test of a civilisation is

the way that it cares for its helpless members." These two leaders and many others point our attention to the importance of treating those who are vulnerable or weak with gentleness, kindness and compassion. In the same way, many passages in the Bible encourage us to be the voice for the voiceless (proverb 31:8-9) and defend the widows, the orphans and all who are vulnerable (James 1:27).

In the last few weeks, I have often wondered what type of society we are building and what we will leave for our children and grandchildren. There is so much maltreatment of the weak and vulnerable. The Post Office scandal and how the Sub-Postmasters were treated and victimised is a prime example. The way refugees and asylum seekers are labelled, victimised, exploited and excluded is another. I am sure one could add many other examples to the list. It is often easy to say I am not involved or that it does not affect me. But this will be a flimsy way of excusing our inaction. For a society to reflect Godliness and good virtues, each of us has a role. As Christians, we need to lead by example. We need to show the world what righteousness and justice look like by how we behave and treat others. We must endeavor to speak out against injustice, exclusions, and discrimination wherever we see such. We allow such behaviors and actions to grow and become the norm when we keep quiet. I encourage you this week to be a voice for those who you know are voiceless and the defender of those who are weak. In doing this, we can build a just society where love reigns and grace abounds. We will meet at 8 and 10 am this Sunday for Holy Communion Services. There will be facilities for children and families during the 10 am Service. We will also meet on Wednesday at 10.30 am.
